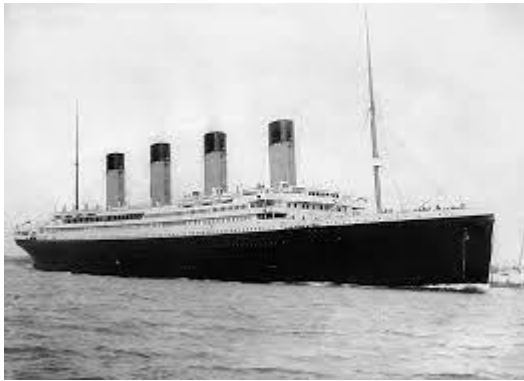

Journeys

- Sir Walter Raleigh organized three major expeditions to America (Roanoke Island) in the hope of impressing Queen Elizabeth. He was determined to explore and colonize America.
- HMS Titanic was a vessel that sank in the North Atlantic Ocean on the 15th April 1912 during her maiden voyage from Southampton to New York City. Passengers journeyed to the USA in search of a better life.
- 1027 Jamaicans passengers travelled on HMT The Windrush Empire in search of a better life in Britain after WW2 in the late 1940's.
- A refugee is a person who has been forced to leave their country to escape war, persecution or natural disaster.
- The Kindertransport brought 10,000 Jewish children to Britain from Central Europe between December 1939 and the beginning of WW2 in September 1939. This was to keep the children safe during the bombing and conflict that took place during WW2.

Migration	Movement of people from one country to another.	Indigenous	Originating from a particular place.
Migrant	A person who moves from one country to another	Refugee	A person who has been forced to leave their country to escape war, persecution or natural disaster.
Immigration	Process of moving to a new country with the intention of staying there	Asylum Seeker	A person who leave their country to search for safety and protection in another country.
Emigration	Leaving your own country to settle permantly in another country.
